Lester Downes Lawn Service returns to St Paul's for our annual spring clean up. Trimming, weeding and mulching.







May All Voices Be Heard St. Paul's Transition and Search Committee

Our parish is beginning a new journey of faith and hope. In the coming months, we will engage our St. Paul's community in Holy Conversations and prayers, inspired by Christ and by oe another, as we seek a new Rector.

This effort must truly "hear all the voices" of St. Paul's. Therefore, before each Sunday Service, a parish member — from the Vestry, the Search Committee, or the congregation-at-large- will offer a short prayer or reflection about our parish transition. These messages will be forward looking and personal, full of joy, and hope for our community of faith.

Transition Team Update

Search and Transition Committee Update

The Search and Transition Committee remains very busy working to find our next rector. The coming weeks will have several important announcements about the progress we are making. We are very pleased with this progress and eager to move into the next phase of the search process. However, we also want to candid about the challenges we face. There is a significant shortage of priests in the Episcopal Church at large. Rather than provide statistics about the number of priests searching versus the number of openings available, or the number of active priests versus the number of congregations in the Episcopal Church, below is a quick summary of the rector situations in the closest Episcopal churches to St. Paul's.

- Wye Parish (Queenstown and Wye Mills): A curate (a very recent graduate of seminary) is leading the congregation with the assistance of the interim priest.
- Christ Church (Kent Island): The former interim priest was converted to a priest-in-charge given the congregations inability to find a permanent rector.
- St. Luke's (Church Hill): A retired priest serves as a part time rector.
- Emmanuel (Chestertown): The fulltime rector is on long term leave for health reasons.
- Old St. Paul's (Chestertown): The congregation has begun the search process for a new rector.
- Christ Church (Easton): An interim is leading the congregation.
- Christ Church (Denton): A bi-vocational priest is leading the congregation in a part time capacity while also teaching math full time in Dorchester County Schools.

While the road ahead is uncertain, if we open our hearts to God's will, we will find our new rector and strengthen our congregation's service to God.


