## Search and Transition Committee Update

The Search and Transition Committee continues to make progress in our work to find St. Paul's next rector. The committee is divided into three teams: Search Team, Transition Team and Communications Team.

The parish profile is almost complete. The Communications Team wrote the narrative for the profile. The entire Search and Transition Committee reviewed the narrative. Last fall's parish survey helped inform the profile narrative. Myron Richardson helped secure the in-kind services of a professional editor to review the narrative.

A graphic designer is currently putting the narrative together with photos for a finished product. The Communications Team is reviewing the first draft of the profile at this time. We are also presently working to update the parish website.

On February 9<sup>th</sup>, we held our first listening session. The second session will be held after service on Sunday March 16<sup>th</sup>. If you have any questions or comments, please come and talk with us.

# Pastoral CARE

To My Dear St. Paul's Family,

I have been asked about Pastoral Care and what is happening now. Result? We need to reorganize and reeducate what our Pastoral Care team does. We also hope you will think about what talents you have and where you can help. You probably don't realize how much you have to offer or perhaps you don't feel you have the time. Our team is extremely flexible and by working together, we accomplish so much. Our Feb 19<sup>th</sup> Pastoral Care meeting was quite productive. I am pretty thrilled about that. Now we need to explain to others our goals.

As my WAZE says, "Let's go."

DO YOU OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW NEED US? You do not need to be on death's door to call Pastoral Care, in fact, that is what clergy is for. In past years, we have even regularly driven people to the hairdresser. Sounds a little goofy, doesn't it, but it was such a tremendous help to a working daughter and a mother who was content knowing she could get to her hair appointments. This daughter is still an extremely grateful parishioner even though her mother is gone, but the daughter is still a member of St Paul's after 30+ years, extremely active, loving and appreciative.

Help shopping? In the days before the grocery store would shop for you, we shopped. Still today, I believe shopping for someone is so much more personal and useful. Human contact, one-on-one conversation, is so important. Do you need help with this?

Visits to Nursing Homes? Do you have a family member who would benefit from our visit? We can do that. We have a visit schedule that is caring and thoughtful. Or, if you would like to have someone available during an invalid's meal time, we can act as that aid and assist.

Do you or a family member need a little companionship? We will sit with shut-ins or people who just had surgery and should not be alone. That's pretty easy for a team member to do. Sometimes we read to them, watch TV with them, play cards, or just sit quietly. When someone is more content with just another person nearby, what a comfort that simple gesture gives. We will not always go to someone with gifts in hand. Yes, sometimes we take the altar flowers, a card, or a trinket, but our smile and warmth is sometimes all that is really needed.

We drive. If you need to be driven to the city or locally, we have members who are comfortable with city driving or local driving. The reason you need to go anywhere is not questioned. We will get you there -- and home again. Uber and County Ride are always available, but having Pastoral Care drive you is so much more personal.

More driving ... feeling stuck? Let's just go for a drive. Fresh air or the sight of the ocean can do wonders. Sometimes depression knocks on your door and we can give a little assistance. Just having someone near you can help. Sometimes laughter even gets involved. Do you ever need that or know someone who does?

We will bring you library books, magazines or dinner. We can have conversations about the weather, your family or the color of the last rainbow.

Years ago we supplied dinners to a family where each of them had extreme dietary needs and restrictions and the breadwinner couldn't keep up because he had to work. We studied, prepared what they needed, and the team took them meals for many weeks. Do you or a family member need a little help here? Would meals help to fill-in because of illness or the main cook must leave town to take care of mom?

Do you need other meals? In the past, we had a schedule to take an aging parishioner dinners after his wife died. He needed to be taught how to use the oven, microwave and dishwasher. We were great teachers and we were so appreciated. The meals were great, too!

We can begin lunch or dinner monthly restaurant or home gatherings that you may join. This can be helpful knowing who out there would like to try this. At one time Symphony Village residents met weekly at Doc's. I don't know if they still do that but any St. Paul's member can do this. We can begin a list to let you know who is interested from St. Paul's. Add your name and preferences to our new list.

Do you know someone who would appreciate a "Get Well" card, "Success," "Sympathy" or "Thinking of You" card from St. Paul's? Please share their name with us. Word of mouth is a good idea here, it is the best way for us to know.

Funerals, of course, you probably know we are always available to help grieving families with receptions. Lifting the burden of planning a reception can be a great gift. You don't need to think about that if you want Pastoral Care to do it for you. I have been told we are among the few churches who still do this. We are grateful we have a wonderful group able to help.

Is there anything you need? Can we help? Simply call or text me or Michele. It will just be a little conversation saying what you need and consider it done!

If any of the above seem silly to you, think twice and call me. Talking, visiting or spending time with another parishioner brings us closer together. At this special time, we all need each other even if it is just a ride and sip at Dunkin, a picnic, or a date to meet for lunch. Scratch the picnic for now, it's too cold!

WHAT DOES PASTORAL CARE NEED? THE ANSWER IS YOU!

Yes, I was pretty darn pleased with Wednesday's turn out. I was even more pleased with those that contacted me saying they could not attend, but please add them to the list of helpers. What is my list?

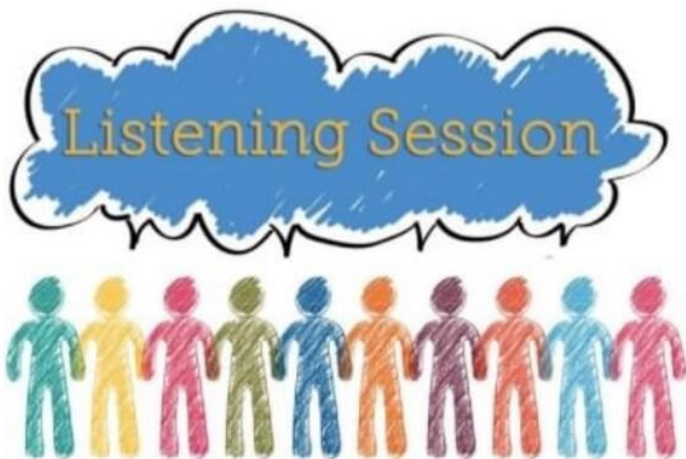
We were fortunate enough to have Rev Mary who was quite good at visiting. She was thoughtful and kept up what she could when she knew there was a need. That being said, Pastoral Care needs to jump in again. At our meeting we worked on scheduling as we did in the past (pre-Mary). We are asking that you and/or a partner, take on a month. Our next open month is April, 2025, then July and August. Many times you won't be called at all during that month, but you will be asked to visit the people residing in nursing homes who are on the list. Don't worry, though, if you can't visit, we always have back up. It has NEVER been my policy to say nasties like "So and so cancelled again." All I need to know is that you checked your calendar and if you can't visit, I respect your decision and I call another team member. That's it!

If you don't feel comfortable trying a month, let me know you like to cook, (I even have a list for "no cooking"), drive and whether locally or city, you are patient sitting waiting, you like board games, you would be happy taking someone to lunch, you will shop or just about anything. It is what YOU like to do and what you are comfortable doing. I have several lists. Lol I will put you on my list of people to call for any particular need. If you are not available at that time, do not fret, we have a couple hundred church members, and the person we need is out there just waiting for their call from me and their turn to help.

Please contact me so I can explain further. I hope you have many questions. Pastoral Care can be very rewarding. The only rule is that we DO NOT gossip about any request we fill. If we must discuss your name, it is with love, kindness, your permission, and with the need to do so.
